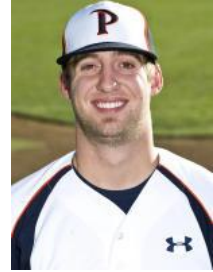


Brad Jesernig LHP – Pepperdine - Sophomore

SPRING 2009: Posted a 6.94 earned-run average through seven relief appearances, totaling 11.2 innings ... Struck out 11 batters and limited them to a .244 average ... Finished five of the games in which he pitched ... Made collegiate debut vs. Evansville (3/6) ... Entered game in the seventh inning for starter Nathan Newman and pitched the final two innings, giving up four runs (two earned) on four hits ... Struck out the side in the seventh inning of a 17-1 win vs. Chicago State (3/21) ... Walked the first Cougar batter he faced on four pitches, but the next three all went down swinging ... Pitched two scoreless innings vs. UC Santa Barbara (5/6), mixing in two strikeouts in between two walks and a hit. **HIGH SCHOOL:** Graduated from Capital High School, located in Olympia, Wash., in 2007 ... A three-year letterman ... Named an all-conference first team selection after senior season ... Selected to the Olympian's All-Area team ... Led Capital to Washington's Elite Eight of the state tournament ... Also lettered in basketball ... Played summer ball with the Wilkinson Academy Cardinals. **PERSONAL** - Born in Olympia, Wash. ... Son of Jim and Cathy Jesernig ... Has one sister, Brenda ... Father competed in track and field at Washington State ... Chose Pepperdine because of "the setting, the baseball program and the pitching quality."
